

- Eggs Week 18 to 25 : Dry Plucked

 Circa 900 farmers throughout the country
 Need maturity to get good feathering
 Need fat cover to hang well
- Eggs Week 26 to 34: Wet plucked
 70 producers throughout the country

• AYRSHIRE - 3 Sites 18% of total (full pedigree replicates)

• NORTHANTS – 2 Sites 38% of total (full pedigree replicates)

• ESSEX – 4 Sites 44% of total (full pedigree replicates)

• All sites have stand alone staffing with no transfer between farms.

PURE LINES

Kelly

 28 Pure lines ranging from 2kg to 30kg mature weights

 We believe we now have the largest selection of coloured turkeys in the world



- Male line more conformation and therefore lower reproduction traits
- Female line more reproductive traits therefore less shape

How can we compete in the breeding world?



- We are not selecting for growth rate
- We have better population genetics
- Its our business

What is our focus for pedigree selection

- Conformation
- Eating quality
 - Breast meat has little flavour
 - Dark meat does
 - Stock comes from a mature carcass
 - There are outstanding individuals

The five stages of development



Explanation of how the breed makes a huge difference

- Blood supply and nervous system
- Vital organs
- Skeletal development 1 week to 18 weeks
- Muscle 15 to 22 weeks
- Fat 16 weeks +


