5. Executive Council Report

a. TAC

Mark Turnbull explained that all Q Guild establishments are being audited for quality and would receive a visit from a Mystery Shopper. The audits are being conducted by Shoppers Anonymous who will conduct 40 visits per year and will audit the shops every 3 years. MT encouraged members to have a look at the Q Guild folder to see the standards that the mystery shopper will be scoring them against.

MT noted that the mystery shopper report is worth looking at. He explained that if any shops did not pass then they would be marked for 'referral' and the TAC would decide next steps on a case by case basis.
