## Regional Support

## Corporate Presentation: Scobies

Tom Lawn presented various topics of interest including Gluten free rusks which will soon be produced in East Kilbride. Demand has overtaken normal rusk. They also have a big range of gluten free sausage packs.

Cook in the bag vacuum packaging is available. GJ felt it was hard to make this look attractive in the counter. PET hinge lidded containers come in all sorts of sizes. Grey trays are recyclable whereas black is not. They have a liquid seal. TL showed the meeting sleeves for sausage packs and offered to brand them with individual member requirements.

AW introduced the eco shop on <u>Scobies.com</u>. She featured pulp fibre biodegradable trays, originally sushi trays.

These trays vary in cost between 10p and 15p. AW hoped that increased volumes would reduce costs. Range will grow.

AW showed counter trays from Dalesbrook. Crescent melamine dishes on special this month. For Christmas white and red kit will be available. Tickets were circulated. Scobies have moved from Magicard to Edikio, a better machine. The software is also better.

TL tabled the proposed November Product of the Month, Blackenburgs made with gold pork sausage mix with GF black pudding mix.
